Dvar Torah: Moshe Raskind

Inspired by Shem Mishmuel

Hashem approaches Moshe to lead the people out of bondage from Egypt. It has been 210 years since Yaakov Avinu entered Egypt, and our promise was that after 400 years we would be redeemed and freed from slavery. Moshe doubted that he was the one that could lead the people out of

Egypt and he was also concerned that he would not be believed since our tradition held that we must remain an additional 190 years.

Hashem, decided to have us leave early because our level of corruption and absorption into the Egyptian society had us fall 49 levels in spiritual purity. A little longer and we would not be able to be saved. We were so absorbed that we were like a fetus inside the mother, whatever happens to the mother immediately affected the fetus or Klal Yisroel. The plagues ended this relationship and for the first time, what happened negatively to the Egyptians. Had a positive outcome on the Children of Yisroel.

Convincing the people to follow Moshe was the task and Hashem gave Moshe 3 signs: He would through his staff and it would turn into a serpent, and he would grab the serpent by the tale and it returned to a stick. Second, he put his hand into his tunic and when he pulled it out it

was full of leprosy. When he returned his hand into his tunic and withdrew it, it was cured. Last, and very different, Moshe filled a container with water from the Nile, and when dumped onto ground, it was blood.

The last of these signs was the most telling. Unlike the other two, the blood did not revert back to its original state. This symbolized that Egypt will not recover from what Hashem was about to do to them.

Let us recognize the signs and wonders that Hashem has revealed to us today, and move toward making Him the center of our lives and hope that like Egypt, Hashem will shorten our suffering and bring the coming of Messiach soon.
