Dvar Torah: Moshe Raskind

The Brit Milah and its link to ketoret

Avraham Avinu was tested by Hashem ten times. Each test was greater than the next. The sixth test was the test of the Brit Milah. Avraham was told to circumcise himself and then to circumcise his son Ishmael and all the men of his household. A Midrash explains this mitzvah in great detail Rabbi Ayvu said after all the men were circumcised the foreskins were piled outside. The sun baked them. The stench was horrible and went up to heaven, like ketoret and sacrifices. God

said when the children sin and perform wicked deeds, I will recall the scent of them and show mercy.

Rashi says that he numerical value of ketoret is 613; like the number of mitzvot in the Torah: 248 positive and 365 prohibitions. Though the incense has a wonderful smell to Hashem, one of the ingredients is chelbenah, which has an awful putrid scent. When burned together, Hashem welcomes the ketoret offering.

Like his children we have Tzedakim as well as sinners. Hashem shows us that like the chelbenah everyone can rise up and enter shamayim and hashem will welcome them all.
