Verse 39:32, states "And the children of Israel did all that Hashem had commanded Moshe." The Or HaChaim questions how the Jewish people are credited for doing all of the work? Betzalel and the wise people of the generation are the ones who completed all of the work, yet the verse credits all of the Jewish people. Berachos 34b states "the actions of an agent are attributed to those who appoint him." Berachos 55a, notes that Hashem actually told Moshe to ask the people whether they considered Bezalel worthy. They responded, "If he is worthy before the Holy One, blessed is He, then he (Betzalel) is certainly worthy before us!"

Or HaChaim continues to explain that the verse establishes that there is a communal bond between all Jews regarding fulfilling the Torah. The Torah was given to be fulfilled by the entire community of Israel as a whole, yet not every individual was granted the opportunity to fulfill every mitzvah nor is every mitzvah given to every person. Rather each person does according to his ability and then they share the merit of their mitzvot with one another. Through the action of the entire nation, the Torah is fulfilled in its entirety.

The Torah alludes to this bond with the commandment "you shall love your fellow as yourself," this means that you should love him because he is as yourself, he's bound to you, for through his well-being and the resultant ability to fulfill his mitzvah obligations, you will benefit, and through his performing mitzvot that you cannot, you achieve your own spiritual completion. This is the rationale behind the Torah's command to love your fellow "as yourself."

Hashem commanded 613 mitzvot, but it's impossible to find any one individual who has fulfilled them all. How then is it possible for any individual to rectify their 248 limbs and 365 sinews corresponding to the mitzvot? It is only through the communal Bond of Israel, in which we share the merit of the mitzvot with one another.

This is what the verse is saying with the words "and the children of Israel did all that Hashem had commanded Moshe." It attributes the individual deeds of each of them to all of them together. Although some of them brought donations and others did labor, the Torah states regarding all of them as a whole that they did "all." Gut Shabbos!
