Dvar Torah: Yosef Chaim Gershuny

In this week's parsha, Hashem tells Moshe Rabbeinu to tell B'nei Yisrael: "I am Hashem and I will take you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, and I will save you from their labor, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and with great judgments. And I will take you to Me as a people, and I will be a G-d to you, and you will know that I am Hashem your G-d, Who has brought you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians. I will bring you to the land, concerning which I raised My hand to give to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, and I will give it to you as a heritage; I am Hashem."

Moshe repeats these words to the people, but the Torah tells us that they didn't listen to him.

This sharply contrasts with last week's parsha, in which Moshe repeats Hashem's words: "I will bring you up out of the affliction of Egypt, to the land of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Perizzites, the Hivvites, and the Jebusites, to a land flowing with milk and honey" and "the

people believed, and they heard that Hashem had remembered the children of Israel and that He saw their affliction, and they kneeled and prostrated themselves." What changed?

The Netziv tells us that the differing reactions reflect the different messages. In parshat Shemot, Moshe delivers Hashem's promise of freedom and prosperity, which pleased them. But in parshat Va'era, Moshe informs B'nei Yisrael that they will be bound as avdei Hashem, and they were displeased with the idea of leaving one state of servitude for another. Indeed, as Chazal tell us, there many Jews who didn't want to leave Egypt. Rashi even suggests that only one-fifth of B'nei Yisrael left Egypt! And this was the reason for Hashem's "outstretched arm": to push the unwilling Jews out of

Egypt, the way a parent may help a child in need despite the child's kicking and screaming against that help.

When we perform the mitzvah of tefillin as remembrance of our redemption from Egypt, we recall Hashem's outstretched arm. We are reminded not just of our freedom, but of Hashem's strength in pushing us out against our will to make us into avdei Hashem. As adults, we can retrospectively appreciate what our parents did for us despite our kicking and screaming as children. But as Jews, we must develop our bitachon and learn to appreciate and trust in Hashem's hashgacha peratit even in the challenges and difficulties we face, knowing that whatever His outstretched arm may have in store for us is also for the good.
