**Dvar Torah**

"A new king arose over Egypt who did not know of Yosef." What changed in the Jews that caused the Egyptians to fear and hate them and why did Pharaoh change his attitude towards them? The Midrash Tanchuma tells us that after the death of the Shevatim the Jews began to enter Egyptian Society. They no longer wanted to be confined to Goshen. They filled the land, mingling with the Egyptians and attending their theaters and circuses. They gave up the Mitzvah of bris milah so they could be similar to their Egyptian Neighbors. Rabbi Avraham Twerski notes that the Beis HaLevi cites the verse "you shall be holy for me, for I, God, am holy, and I have separated you from the people's to be mine". Leviticus 20:26 "It is God's will that Jews remain distinct and separate from other peoples. When they try to assimilate, God turns their Gentile neighbors against them to preserve the separation. The more the Jews attempt to blur the separation, the more anti-Semitism increases." We see this Jewish mistake repeated throughout history. Our task is to remain strongly committed to the Torah and mitzvas while maintaining our holiness and separateness. In addition, everything that Pharaoh had was because of Yosef and yet once he passed, Pharaoh forgot. The all too common "what-have-you-done-for-me-lately" mindset teaches us that the nature of a person, no matter how much one does for them, is to forget. We must strive to always remember what others have done for us and constantly show gratitude. By remaining strong, holy, and separate as Jews and maintaining a sense of gratitude to anyone who has helped us, we will correct these mistakes of the past and merit the ultimate geula with the coming of Moshiach speedily in our Days.
