

In this week's Parashot we read about the construction of the Mishkan and the incredible detail that is put into its decoration. Immediately, one wonders, if Hashem required such intricacies, would it not have been better to have willed the Ark and Mishkan into existence Himself?

The answer is, according to R' Meir Simcha of Dvinsk, that if Hashem had created it Himself, then the Israelites may have been drawn to worship the Mishkan. By having Betzalel build the Mishkan, it becomes a place not of divine origin, but a place made by Jews to worship G-d.

When told he would be building the Mishkan, Moses informed Betzalel to begin with the Holy Vessels that would be placed in the Mishkan. With all due respect, Batzelel asked Moshe, does one decorate their home before building it?

Trying to apply the Torah to our own lives is a lifelong process. Making Torah primary in all one's endeavors takes patience, study and prayer.

In today's society too many people have lost the sense of G-d's presence, and worship the very things meant only to be instruments. So many Jews decorate with tremendous amounts of Judaica as a way to identify with their heritage. Without, the worship of Hashem, these vessels are empty and useless. We must build our homes as our own Mishkans: structures for learning Torah and observing Hashem's mitzvot so that we indeed become a beacon of light and truth to all nations and prepare for the coming of Meshiach.
