Dvar Torah

Why did Yaakov publicly love Yosef so much in front of the brothers? Didn't he know that this would lead to jealousy and eventually much worse? Also the Sf'as Emes writes that "Vayeishev Yaakov" (Yaakov settled), tells us that finally in this period of time Yaakov Avinu was able to settle down after being chased by Esav and cheated by Lavan. Yet, how is this "settled" when his son was sold and the first exile was started?!!

We can answer that truthfully, we never fully settle in life. We always have trials and moments of stumbling. The moment of "settling" is when one realizes that the moment that they are in is able to be expanded and last forever. At that moment, the individual masters his darkness and "settles" into his own moment. That's what happened here, Yaakov knew that the Galut was inevitable and needed in order to increase Hahsem's presence in this world. With that he wanted to impart a message for the future generations. That when your son (or anyone) comes to you with a dream (such as Yosef) that shows a better and bigger future for that person, you have to accept and encourage that person! By doing this, one gives room for growth and a bigger potential. Yet, this kind of acceptance and love is natural for a father, but not for a brother. That's why the brothers had a hard time accepting him. We all have to accept each other's dreams and work on those moments that can last forever, as the way that the 1 candle of Chanukah lasts forever. Shabbat Shalom from Isaac Mass!
