## **Dvar Torah: Sam Paris**

Rabbienu Bachaya explains that (13,2) "Shelach Lecha Letoalescha" You (Moshe) should send the spies for your sake and benefit." He continues, "The benefit is that your life will be prolonged due to the wandering in the desert."

It's hard to understand how this could be seen as a benefit to Moshe. The consequences of this sin had catastrophic results. The entire generation was wiped out, all 600,000 men from ages 20-60. This was the initiation of a "night for crying" (Tisha BAv) for generations, which still impacts us to this day.

Additionally, Chazal talk about how Moshe was chosen specifically to lead Klal Yisroel due to his care and concern for a single sheep

(with regard to the incident of the burning bush.) If Moshe cared for the pain and discomfort of a single lamb, certainly he would empathize and agonize over the destruction of his fellow brethren, the chosen nation.

Shouldn't the sea of negativity from this sin eclipse the drop of benefit received? True, there was a benefit. The reality was that his life was prolonged. But under the circumstances, shouldn't they get glossed over and go unnoticed?

Yet, we see that Hashem was pointing this out (by using this language in the Torah, as every word/letter is specifically chosen meticulously) as a lesson for us. Hashem wanted Moshe to focus on this component as well. Amid all the destruction and negativity there was a benefit. The human condition is such, that we can hold conflicted emotions within us simultaneously and appropriately give praise to Hashem for the positives amidst the negative. There is always a silver lining. It just has to be noticed and focused on.
