Dvar Torah

Why is it that Hashem tells Moshe Rabbeinu to go forward to Pharaoh, when every single time he goes he is met with stubbornness? This week's Parsha may give us the solution. It says (Shmos 10:1) "Come to Pharaoh, for I have hardened his heart.... to place my signs amongst his midst" The next verse writes..."And in order that you can tell over to the ears of your sons....And you will know that I am Hashem". Note two things, first why does it say "Come" and not "Go"? And why only after the 2nd verse does it say "And you know that I am Hashem"? You wouldn't know that, after placing God's signs amongst the impurity of Pharaoh?!

The answer can be that Hashem is saying "come to me", I am here already in the filth and I need you to make a personal sacrifice to come & spread my name over here. However, the only way will be able to identify with Hashem in such darkness is when there is a relationship between us & Hashem. That is why after the 1st verse, which describes God's part (as in his signs will be in place) we won't necessarily know that's Hashem, because we as humans weren't so much involved in that. Yet, once we start relating this over to our children and we become fascinated and drawn to Hashem, that is when WE WILL KNOW HASHEM! Only once the father gives, and the children reciprocate will we be able to feel, believe and love Hashem. This can also be why the first mitzvah was sanctifying the moon. As that symbolizes connecting the above with the below, and this mitzvah can only be done by us! If we don't sanctify it, it won't be sanctified for that month. It is up to us to make that connection and thereby enrichen our relationship with Hashem. Shabbat Shalom! Isaac Mass
