TOPIC FOR SHABBAT TABLE DISCUSSION

In last week's Parasha as we read about forbidden species. One such species is the Stork, also called the Chasidah. According to Rashi, the Chasidah was given this name because it would share food with other members of its species. Some communities were so enamored with this bird that they considered it kosher. If this bird is so "compassionate" (Art Scroll Chumash) why is it considered not kosher by most? "The Rizhiner Rebbe responded that this is because it directs its kindness exclusively towards its fellows, but will not help other species. To Jews, this is not an admirable Characteristic." (Art Scroll Chumash.) What is the lesson?

As Jews we need to not only be concerned with our own, but with the world: Other people. When an earthquake hits Haiti, are we as a community there? When the homeless need to be fed, are we there? Individuals may, but as a Torah Observant Community are we there for them?

We self-define as the **Light to All Nations**: *what are we doing to shine? What are we doing to not insulate ourselves thus making ourselves invisible to others? Is living Torah principles what helps us to develop and grow? Are we the Stork?*
