The last four stories of this week parsha all involve negative speech and each one resulted in strong negative consequences. The first, "The people took to seeking complaints; it was evil in the ears of Hashem, and Hashem heard and his wrath flared, and a fire of Hashem burned against them, and it consumed at the edge of the camp." The second, "The rabble that was among them cultivated a craving, and the Children of Israel also wept once more, and said, who will feed us meat?" Moshe said, "Until an entire month of days, until it comes out of your nose, and becomes nauseating to you." "The meat was still between their teeth, net yet chewed, when the wrath of Hashem flared against the people, and Hashem struck a very mighty blow against the people."

The third, "Two men remained behind in the camp, the name of one was Eldad and the name of the second was Medad...and they prophesied in the camp." Joshua son of Nun, the servant of Moses since his youth, spoke up and said, my lord Moshe, incarcerate them!" Joshua spoke negative about Eldad and Medad and the Talmud (Eruvin 63a) says he was punished by being childless. The fourth, Miriam and Aaron spoke against Moshe...and Hashem's wrath flared up against them...and behold Miriam was afflicted with tzaraas like snow!

We learn from these stories that negativity in thought and especially in speech is contagious and leads to more negativity which leads to negative consequences sometimes even fatal consequences chas v'Shalom. We must make every effort to see the good, judge favorably, and guard our tongues from evil speech, this will not only provide us a protection against Hashem's wrath, it will even bring his blessings upon us including the ultimate blessing of the coming of Moshiach, speedily in our days.
