Dvar Torah: Yehoshua Glatt

There is a beautiful Midrash in this week's parashah (Vayikrah Rabbah 35:1) in which Dovid proclaims to Hashem, "Ribbono shel olam, every day I say I'm going to such and such place and such and such house, and (yet) my legs carry me to the shul and the Beis Medrash (to learn Torah)!" Rav Henschel Leibowitz zt"l asked a penetrating question here. Dovid Hamelech was a tzaddik. If he had planned to go somewhere other than to learn Torah, he must have determined that what Hashem wants at that moment is to take care of that thing. How then could he drop it to go to the Beis Medrash?

Rav Henschel explained, it's true Dovid

wasn't going to the Beis Medrash when the proper thing was to take care of something else. But so many times it's so hard to know if it's truly the right thing, or if really the learning takes precedence and that thing could wait. Without a 'my legs carry me to the Beis Medrash' love of Torah, we will often err in making that judgement call. The love of Torah enabled Dovid to see clearly whether or not the 'thing to take care of' at any given moment was truly the right thing, or merely the deception of the yetzer harah.

In 2019 this is perhaps more relevant than ever. As Rabbi Bienenfeld often says, modern technology comes with a downside- the never ending 'to-do'. If a person truly wants to grow in Torah, he must teach himself to *desire* Torah, to *pine* for Torah; to *love* Torah.
