Dvar Torah: Vivian Richmond

This week we learn about the *korbanos* (offerings) brought by the twelve princes on twelve consecutive days for the dedication of the altar in the *Mishkan*. It is often asked that if the Torah does not include any unnecessary words, why was each one of the twelve *korbanos* described in detail even though they were all identical? Why were all the offerings identical? And were the offerings really identical? The answers to these questions can give us insight into how we can serve *Hashem* properly.

The Abarbanel (in the "Abarbanel on the Torah" for Parshas Nasso) explains that the princes decided on their own that their offerings would be exactly the same, at least, physically, in order to avoid any jealousy or competition among them. We can learn from this that the Torah is testifying that while the princes were of varying levels of wealth, the offering of the least distinguished prince was as special to Hashem as the offering of the

most distinguished prince, because Hashem accepted and loved them all equally.

The *Medrash Rabbah* explains that the *korbanos* were not identical from a spiritual standpoint; each prince brought his offering with his own *kavanah* (intentions) to reflect his true inner self. For example, Nachshon's *korban* embodied the idea of rulership, which represented the strength of the tribe of Yehudah; the leader of the tribe of Yissacher offered a *korban* that represented Torah; and the korban from the tribe of Zevulin represented commerce to fund to Torah learning. Each prince's *kavanah* that accompanied his offering demonstration.

strated his inner uniqueness, and each prince can serve as a role model for serving Hashem properly.

The Gemara in Niddah, 31-A, explains that of the three partners involved in the creation of a newborn baby, the physical components come from the father and the mother (the father is the source of the bones, brain, sinews, and part of the eye; the mother is the source of the flesh, skin, hair, and pupil), while the spiritual component comes from Hashem. G-d gives each person a neshama (soul), in addition to the form of the face, the ability to see, hear, speak, and walk, as well as the power of understanding - our intelligence. Our G-d-given abilities enable us to realize our unique purpose in this world. A key step to this realization is self-reflection.

To begin our inner search, Rabbeinu Yonah of Gerondy in *The Gates of Service*, writes: a person has to know his worth; his qualities; and the qualities of his parents, their greatness, and their parents' value; and the love that Hashem has for them...." We can ask ourselves, what are our strong and weak points, our likes and dislikes. When we look inside ourselves to find our core essence, we can open the door to discover our purpose and gain a much clearer idea of how to serve *Hashem* with authenticity.

May we each be successful in our service to Hashem.
