"צו את אהרון ואת בניו לאמר"

פרק ו, פסוק ב

Inspire for Perpetuity

The passuk says, "צו את אהרון ואת בניו לאמר" "Command B'nei Aharon and his sons saying". The question is why does the passuk say צו? Why not say אמר or דבר? In the simple pshat without the word אהרון, צו might have thought that the commandment is only telling him and his sons instructions that the avodah is for now. But by the passuk saying, צו את אהרון, according to Rashi, אהרון understood that this "symbolized an urging a, "דריזות," for him & his sons to be careful in the mitzvas for now and for the generations to come". How does Rashi learn "דריזות" from the passuk? The answer is, and I think we can all agree with this, that many times, unfortunately, when we are told or asked to do something, especially

something that we don't necessarily want to do, we won't see the urgency and so we won't acquiesce very fast to do it. But if we get commanded to do it, well, then naturally we recognize the urgency which inspires us to do what was asked. What is so fundamentally important about being a דריז, דריזות, a natural offshoot of צו, to be commanded, gives the commanded action a sense of importance. It is this very action of making the commanded act important that leaves it with a legacy and tradition to be passed down to future generations.

As we move past Purim and onto Pesach there will be many opportunities for us to find a way to be a דריז and when our children and others see us in action they too will want to follow. As we read in the Parsha of Shema, "ושננתם לבניך" "Teach it to your children"! We want our children to keep the mitzvas of the Torah going L'Dor Dor from generation to generation. It is the chain of inspiration for future generations that will continue our mesorah. So, lets get to it, just like אהרון הכהן and inspire and make an investment of perpetuity! In this merit may we be zoche to build the final Beis Hamikdash B'korov and if it has already been built may we be zoche to serve in it במהרה בימנו אמן!
